General Device Information

Device Cleaning

- Clean the device with mild soap and water
- Air dry
- Liners should be stored with the gel facing inward to prevent debris from sticking to it

General Comfort

Redness (present longer than 20 minutes after the prosthesis is removed), bruising, or other uncomfortable symptoms should be discussed with a prosthetist

Weather/Environment

- Devices are not to be submerged in water, unless specifically designed for such an activity
- If device is exposed to salt or chlorinated water, rinse immediately with untreated water
- Limit exposure to extreme heat and sun

When should I come in for an adjustment or repair?

Call to book an appointment if:

- Your activity level has changed
- The fit of your device has changed
- A change in weight has occurred
- Growth has occurred

Expectations of Care

RCC P/O Staff Should:

- Provide adequate information regarding device and care
- Consider client perspectives
- Provide functional testing and practice if required

Prosthetic device users should:

- Use device as directed by clinicians
- Care for device as discussed
- Discuss any design concerns or questions about device with clinicians as soon as possible

Prosthetics Appointments

Evaluation and Casting (1-2 appointments):

At this appointment, your prosthetist will ask about your general medical history and perform a casting or scan of your limb

Appointment Length: 90 minutes

Following appointment booked for: 1-3weeks

Fitting (2-5 appointments):

Your clinician will assure proper fit and alignment of your prosthesis and perform modifications to the socket as necessary

Appointment Length: 60-90 minutes

Following appointment booked for: 1-3weeks

Delivery:

After confirming the final fit of your prosthesis, you will be taught how to properly:

- don and doff your device
- perform any specific functions of the device
- care and maintain the device

Appointment Length: 60-90 minutes

Following appointment booked for: 1-4 weeks

Follow up appointment:

Your prosthetist will confirm that your prosthesis is fitting and functioning well

Appointment Length: 60-90 minutes

- *Factors affecting the length of time before the next appointment may include:
 - Living arrangements
 - Componentry ordered
 - Type of device

Device Options

Devices are custom designed for patients based on multiple factors such as age, presentation, and other contextual factors

Interface

<u>Masterflex liner</u> - This liner accommodates growth, facilitates easy donning and doffing, and is often used with anatomical suspension methods

Roll on liner



<u>Silicone</u> – This liner is particularly hygienic, soft but durable, and works best with pin-suspension systems

<u>TPE</u> – This liner is able to be thermomoulded to the shape of your limb if necessary.

Suspension



<u>Pin liner</u> –This type of suspension is easy for donning and doffing a prosthesis



<u>Harness</u> - This type of suspension is easy to don and doff, as well as adjust. This suspension may often be paired with a cosmetic device or to help control a conventional device

<u>Anatomical suspension</u> – Certain residual limb shapes allow for the prosthesis to suspend naturally from your arm, without the need for extra componentry.





Device Options

Terminal Devices

Cosmetic (passive prosthesis) appears similar to sound limb side





<u>Cable operated options</u> - allows the user to perform specific tasks such as opening and closing, operated via a shoulder harness.

Options include:

- Hook terminal device or anatomical hand
- Option for voluntary open or voluntary close of hand

Myoelectric—Electrical signals from the muscles connect with electrodes on the device to allow user to open and close the hand

<u>Recreational</u> – many commercial and custom made options for a variety of specific tasks

Examples of recreational devices:

- · Sports (hockey, golf, swimming)
- · Music (violin, trumpet, guitar)
- · Recreation (yoga, weight lifting, cycling)









Cosmetic Finishes



<u>Laminated patterns</u> – A variety of patterns are available, customizable by patient

<u>Silicone or PVC gloves</u> – This finish is made to look like the sound side hand
