### Independent Auditor's Report

To the Board of Directors of Rehabilitation Centre for Children, Inc.

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Statement of Public Sector Compensation Disclosure of Rehabilitation Centre for Children, Inc. (the "Organization") for the year ended December 31, 2023 ("the statement").

In our opinion, the financial information in the statement of the Organization for the year ended December 31, 2023 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with Section 2 of The Public Sector Compensation Disclosure Act.

#### **Basis of Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Compensation for senior-level staff at the Rehabilitation Centre for Children, Inc. (the "Centre") reflects this organization's breadth, depth, and diversity as a provincial health care facility providing services to children with physical disabilities throughout the Province of Manitoba.
